BACKGROUND INFORMATION:		
<p>Paragraph 1 of Article 12 of the Convention states that the Parties recognize that rendering of timely and appropriate technical assistance in response to the requests from developing country Parties and Parties with economies in transition is essential to the successful implementation of the Convention.</p> <p>In every COP including at COP-5, many representatives of developing countries called for increased assistance, including for capacity-building and training, to enhance knowledge and decision-making capacity in developing country parties and parties with economies in transition for the implementation of the Convention, as mandated by decision SC-5/20.</p> <p>The proposed activities to be carried out under this project focus on core areas to meet the obligations under the Convention, where the Secretariat is expected to play a lead role. Parties are enabled to participate in the principal activities (meetings of the Conference of Parties) and fulfill their obligations under the Convention.</p> <p>Guidance and technical guidelines, which are already available or currently being developed, such as the BAT&BEP/Toolkit for unintentionally produced POPs, the NIP updating guidance for new POPs, will be extensively used as part of the project.</p>
