Highlights


- BC COP-14, RC COP-9 and SC COP-9 back-to-back from 29 April -10 May 2019, CICG, Geneva
- Theme of the meetings: "Clean Planet, Healthy People: Sound Management of Chemicals and Waste"
- No high-level segment
- Expect about 1,500 participants from up to 187 Parties
- Exhibitions, information fair (2-4 May) and side events

Financial support and registration

- Financial assistance:

- On-site registration:

 - 8 am to 5 pm on Monday, 29 April 2019
 - 9 am to 5 pm during other days
 - Need to register to be included in the list of participants



Credentials

- Bureaux: <u>Original</u> and <u>copies</u> of credentials in good order will be accepted, with the understanding that the original will be submitted as soon as possible
- Credentials are to be issued by the Head of State or Government or by the Minister for Foreign Affairs
- Submission to the Secretariat if possible no later than 24 hours after the opening of the meetings (by 10 a.m. on Tuesday, 30 April 2019)
- Model for credentials available in all 6 UN languages
- Credentials for all 3 meetings can be in one document
- Hand over original credentials at the meeting venue





Organization of work

- Similar approach to 2017:
 - Pre-meetings (e.g. bureaux, regions) on the day before the meetings
 - Joint sessions on joint issues on first day and a half
 - Separate COPs: SC BC RC
 - Conclude with joint and separate sessions, as necessary
- Tentative schedule and list of possible contact groups agreed to by bureaux at their joint meeting
- Limited number of contact groups running in parallel
- Keep in mind that order and timing of sessions might change

Election of officers: rules and requirements

- According to the financial rules, no representative of any Party whose contributions are in arrears for 2 or more years shall be eligible to become a member of the Bureau of the COP or its subsidiary bodies. Rule does not apply to LDCs, SIDS or Parties that have agreed on and are respecting a schedule of payments
- When putting forward nominations of member and experts, **Parties should take** into account the following for each candidate:
 - Required time and travel needs
 - Qualifications (where relevant)
 - Submission of documentation in support of candidatures (CV and signed declaration of interest form for CRC and POPRC)
- Replacement of CRC and POPRC members shall be done in accordance with such procedure as the region concerned may determine
- Discussion of nominations in advance of COPs and gender balance are encouraged

- 2 scenarios:
 - Zero nominal growth scenario
 - Executive Secretaries' scenario, 5% growth (2.5% annually)

Memorandums of Understanding between UNEP and the COPs (and FAO in the case of RC)

- Three convention-specific MoUs in front of the COPs for possible adoption
- Developed by the Secretariat in consultation with UNEP (and FAO for RC)

Information on hosting meetings of the COPs outside the seats of the Secretariat (see BC/INF/57–RC/INF/46–SC/INF/60)

- INF document invited offers from Parties to host 2021 COPs by 29 March 2019
- Offer from Government of Kenya was received to host the 2021 COPs at UNEP Headquarters in Kenya, Nairobi (→ Addendum)
- If accepted by the COPs hosting would be subject to the conclusion of a host country agreement between the host Government and the Secretariat
