Given the past practice of regional rotation, the co-chairs of the Bureau of the OEWG for the biennium 2020–2021 could be expected to be elected from among African States, Latin American and Caribbean States or Western European and other States, and the Rapporteur from Central and Eastern European States or Western European and other States.
